Dear Dana Ward Family,

This week was pretty sweet. I was in divisions almost the whole week. And tomorrow I'm going to Tecate again to do interviews. We've been having a lot of success as a "zona". These last two weeks of Diciembre should be pretty sweet. We have a lot of baptisms lined up.

It's been raining the last few days. We're actually going to go and play soccer right now with an investigator that we have. His name is Juan Carlos. He came to Church by himself yesterday at 9 am despite getting home from a 16 hour shift at 6 am that morning. He took his son and they both loved it. We're way excited for them. They live in a house made out of plywood. The locks that a lot of people have on their doors are like this: They cut a hole in the house and a hole in the door. And then they put a big chain through the two holes and lock it. Pretty crazy, huh?

It sure was great to talk to you guys over Christmas. There is a member family that lives in the apartment above us and they invited us over for dinner. We were even included in the family gift exchange. They gave me three pairs of some way sweet socks. They're a really great family. They're always helping us.

Well, everything seems to be in order for the wedding of Eduardo and Fabiola. They're going to get married tomorrow in San Luis Rio Colorado, Sonora. A judge there marries people quickly and affordably. The process in Baja California Norte takes about a month. In Sonora, it takes fifteen minutes. They are really excited to be getting married. They were going to get married last Friday. But all last week there was a severe snow storm in a mountain range called the Rumorosa. The only way to get to Sonora is through there. A boulder about the size of a small house fell in the middle of the road. The highway was closed down for a few days. But now, it's open again.

We had a really good day at Church yesterday. We took eleven investigators. Five of them had already been, six went for the first time. One of them, Artemio, is a die-hard Catholic. He walked into the chapel after the meeting had already started, found a seat and immediately kneeled down and started praying out loud. It was a bit awkward, but most people are patient with investigators attending for a

first time. He and his family want to come back next Sunday. Our zone had a pretty good week and baptized 28 this month. We hope that in January we can baptized a lot more and have set a goal of 45. Every one is really excited and ready to work.

Elder Musick gave me my flight itinerary today when I went to the office. It looks like I'll be arriving home in the afternoon? Is there any chance we can make a stop on the way home from the airport, at Bill Johnson's?

I love you guys. Thank you all for your love and support. I hope that you all had a Merry Christmas and hope that you have a Happy New Year. Have a great week.
