Dear Brothers and Sisters of the Dana Ward, In many parts of the world, the second Sunday in May is dedicated to expressing appreciation for our Mothers. It would be entirely appropriate to devote many more days and many more expressions of gratitude as we contemplate the importance and contribution of mothers and women.

As Priesthood holders, we should strive each day to honor our wives, mothers and sisters. As fathers, grandfathers and priesthood holders we strive to teach our sons, grandsons and young men in the ward, the proper way to show respect to the women in our lives. Two of the purposes of the Aaronic Priesthood is to (1) Prepare to become worthy husbands and fathers and (2) Give proper respect to women, girls and children.

Dear Dana Ward



I am really enjoying my time here in Formosa. I'm so glad I was sent here after their summer weather as it was hotter here than it ever gets in Arizona. The people here are very nice and are willing to help in any way they can. The members are amazing and of course, I enjoy the lunch appointments! One of my goals was to lose 100 # while on my mission. That goal is almost impossible because of all the food the members give us. They insist that you eat 3 or 4 plates of food and then they serve dessert. It would be rude and may offend them if we refused it, so we force ourselves to eat everything they give us!

I celebrated my 21st birthday last week! I can't believe it! We had transfers last week also and neither my companion, Elder Hyde, or myself was transferred. We really enjoy working together. He has been out for 5 months now and is a hard worker. I will complete my mission service here in Formosa. I am trying to keep up my usual pace and not let down these last few weeks. We are having lots of fun. Elder Vargas goes home this week, to Antofagasta, Chile. He has become such a good friend of mine and I will miss him dearly.

On our last P-day, we got to play basketball with a famous basketball team from Argentina. A local member hooked us up. Three of the players are from the States; from New York, Kentucky and Maryland. They are cool guys. It was a fun experience!

We had a bit of a comedy experience a couple of weeks ago. We were invited to teach a lesson at Tamara's house and after the lesson, she invited us to go out in her back yard to see her sheep. Something scared the sheep and they bolted and took off running. They broke down the front yard fence and escaped into and down the street. We ran after them, trying to help. A bunch of the neighborhood dogs joined in the chase and in all the yelling, noise and confusion, the dogs attacked the sheep and some of them were hurt. We felt bad

about the sheep getting hurt, but later, the humor of the total picture did make us laugh (but not till we got home).

Elder Hyde and I were so pleased that we had 8 investigators at Church on Sunday. I was working exchanges with my Zone Leader, Elder Andrews, and we tried visiting many of our investigators but no one was home. So we decided to contact. The very first door we knocked on was the Grance Family. They are a GOLDEN Family! They consist of a father and mother and 4 girls ages 13, 11, 7 and 4. We invited them to read the pamphlet about the Restoration of the Gospel and they not only read it but discussed it as a family. We invited them to attend Church on Sunday and they agreed to come but said we didn't need to come by as they could

find their way to the chapel. However, Sunday morning, it was raining pretty hard so we decided to go by for them and we managed to get a taxi and went to their house. We knocked and knocked on their door but got no answer so we got back in the taxi and were just pulling away from the curb when my cell phone rang. It was the family father. He said he tried to stop us but couldn't get to us fast enough and asked if we would come back for them. We turned around and went back. The mother and 2 of the girls rode in the taxi with us and the Dad and the other 2 little girls rode on his motorcycle. When we arrived at the church, two more investigators were waiting, giving us a total of 8 investigators at church this week. Their little girl Sofie, has some health issues and towards the end of Sac. Meeting, she got sick. With the parent's permission, we gave her a blessing and she felt fine afterwards. The Lord's blessings are tremendous and after 2 years in the mission field, I can see the little miracles we are allowed to participate in every day.

A mission is an eye opening experience. Comforts that would be considered ordinary and normal at home are very expensive and often non-existant here. I'm so glad to have been called to serve in Argentina. I have met so many new people and experienced a new culture. I won't take so many things for granted once I'm back home. I love it! It has been a good experience for so many reasons.

We finally baptized Johnny Johnny. Elder Clark baptized him on Saturday and I confirmed and blessed him with the gift of the Holy Ghost on Sunday. He is doing really good. Pohnpeians don't usually do anything when it rains and when it rains on Sundays church attendance really suffers. For example, there were 7 people total at church this Sunday and that included the missionaries, the branch president and his wife and kid, the only

teacher and one of his sisters. They all live practically next door to the building. So it wasn't looking promising that Johnny was going to make it for his confirmation. He lives at least a 20 minute walk away and it was raining pretty hard. Before we finished the opening hymn, Johnny showed up. So everything worked out. Things are good with me. We are now looking for the next person in the area who might be prepared for the gospel at this time.

We got to watch conference on the 17th and 18th of April. It's a week later than they get it on Guam but hey, at least we got it. It came in Pohnpeian. However, we also got an English DVD and we watched it at home during lunch and dinner. There were a few talks that really stand out to me; Elder Bradley D. Foster's talk, President Eyring's talk on Saturday morning, Elder Holland's talk and Brother Beck's talk from the Priesthood session.

Unfortunately, Bristla, another investigator, has kinda fallen off the map. She ditched an appointment and we haven't really seen her since. it's disappointing but things like that happen.

I got the dictionary you sent and it was just what I needed. I am doing well with the language goals.

They have something here called a "nos" that interests me. It's really useful and they use it to provide shade for parked cars, socialize, drink and make sokow (which is against the word of wisdom), and do pretty much everything. They're really cool.

We drive a car now and use it to get into the main village once a week - on P-days. The sister missionaries backed into a parked car and a brick wall, despite the use of a backer, so for some reason the mission decided to give them our bikes and give us their car. When we had bikes, other missionaries would come and pick us up and we would do our errands that way. We are able to do laundry, email, shopping, etc. now, with the car. I guess the best description of where we live would be called a village. I think in the local language it is called a 'kosop'.

Since coming to Pohnpei I have been doing pretty good and have had some good experiences. I still wear my glasses and have not had any further problems with my eyes.

Thanks for your support and the love that you show me all the time.
