#### Dear Dana Ward,

As we again prepare to celebrate the birth of our Savior I am reminded that Elder David A. Bednar once suggested that we might look at the symbols of Christmas a bit differently.

He noted that the tree is the central figure in Lehi's vision (1 Nephi:8). "The tree is Christ and the fruit on the tree are the blessings of the Atonement."

He also spoke about Christmas lights. "It is not a coincidence that the Savior, on the American continent, where the sign of His birth was a day and a night and a day where there was no darkness... said, "I am the light and the life of the world."

The shepherds, whose flocks were destined for divine sacrifice, were special stewards. There were many shepherds in Palestine, but only to those who watched over the temple flocks did the herald angels come. Only they heard the heavenly choir. Those were not ordinary sheep.

Next to trees covered by lights, many times there are manger scenes with Joseph and Mary and the baby Jesus, and sheep and shepherds. We may never look at the sheep and shepherds quite the same way again.

This time of year, people often ask, "Are you ready for Christmas?" Bro. Bednar added, "I don't think the question is, 'Are you ready for Christmas?'..." The Father's gift to us was His Son. The gift from the Son to us is His Atonement." Perhaps the only thing that we could give Them is a growing conviction, a deepening conversion of the Atonement of Jesus Christ and what it means in our lives. Perhaps the only thing we could give would be a more diligent desire and commensurate study, to not just

know about the Atonement, but to know Him who brought the Atonement and to more fully understand the blessings of the Atonement in our lives."

This Christmas season, I bear you my testimony that Jesus is the Christ. He lived. He walked the earth. He taught His doctrine. He organized His Church. He is the Son of God. He was crucified, but more important, He is resurrected. He lives. He speaks. He stands at the head of His Church today.

May each of us be blessed at this joyous season of the year and may we acknowledge with gratitude, the Father's incomparable gift to us of His Son, the Lord Jesus Christ. I wish each of you a Merry Christmas Season and a Healthy, and Happy New Year.

## The Shepherds

Late March through early April was lambing season, and shepherds may have been laboring in Bethlehem's hillside fields the night of Christ's birth, assisting the ewes in the births of their lambs. It is likely that these were no ordinary animals, for Jewish law proclaimed that only flocks designated for temple sacrifice could be raised near cities. (The life & Times of Jesus the Messiah by Alfred Edersheim, 1972, 2:186)

"And, lo, the angel of the Lord came upon them {the shepherds}, and the glory of the Lord shone round about them, and they were sore afraid.

"And the angel said unto them, Fear not: for, behold, I

bring you good tidings of great joy, which shall be to all people.

For unto you is born this day in the city of David {Bethlehem} a Savior, which is Christ the Lord. And this shall be a sign unto you; Ye shall find the babe wrapped in swaddling clothes, lying in a manger. And suddenly there was with the angel a multitude of the heavenly host praising God, and saying, Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace, good will toward men. (Luke 2:9-14) With the departure of the angels, the shepherds went "with haste" to see for themselves, the Messiah, the newborn "Lamb of God... the Son of the Eternal Father who would grow to become the Shepherd of Israel - and be sacrificed for his flock. After their visit, they spread the joyous word of the Messiah's birth, and all they that heard it wondered at those things which were told them by the shepherds. (Ensign, Dec 1997, pg 43)

Dear Dana Ward, We had a nice Thanksgiving here on Guam. We enjoyed a very nice dinner with Pres. And Sis. Dowdle along with some brand new missionaries that arrived that morning and some who had just been transferred to Guam. It was a very large group and lots of fun. We also enjoyed a dinner Saturday in a member's home. There was a TON of food! We got lots of invitations from members. It's really nice to be well taken care of here.

We are gearing up for the visit from Elder L. Tom Perry on Dec. 10<sup>th</sup>. It is planned that all the branches will be made into wards. There are no wards here now. I think they are expecting to become a stake.

We are enjoying working with several investigators. A lady we have been teaching came to church for the first time and seems to like it. She said she is more than willing to come again. Florence, our investigator the sisters are teaching, came for the 2<sup>nd</sup> time and also attended the branch Thanksgiving party held on Saturday. When we visited last week, her daughter was ill and we gave her a blessing. We are also teaching a husband and wife who just recently moved here from Hawaii. The wife is a fairly inactive member, but her husband is showing interest in the Church and told us when he knows what we are teaching is the truth, he would like to be baptized. He noted the presence of the Spirit in the lesson we taught him. The members here are so good to fellowship our investigators. We also have a husband and wife who have been attending meetings for about 7 years and they have never been baptized. Last night, we taught them and they have requested to be baptized right away. So – we have set Dec. 4<sup>th</sup> for their baptism. It is really cool and amazing that things work out like this.

Also last night, we got a late call from a member asking us if we could come give him a blessing. He just got word that his father has passed away and he was upset and trying to make arrangements to go home to attend his funeral but couldn't find his passport. We gave him a blessing and right after we got home, he called to say he had found his passport and things were going to work out. It was a neat experience for Elder Garcia and myself.

I'm adjusting to working in the Mission Office and am also coming to enjoy it. I enjoy sharing our 4man apartment with the other Elders and am learning so much about what it takes to efficiently run a mission and all that must happen to make sure the Church runs smoothly. For example: I was surprised at how much it costs just for air fare since that is how all travel must be done here to cover the islands of our mission. It costs about \$40 to \$50,000 every month just for travel expenses. We drive a car here which means I spend most of my time sitting! I have learned my new companion in the coming transfers will be Elder Iglesia. He was my companion back on Pohnpei and we worked well together. We made lots of changes while on Pohnpei and will be working together again for lots of changes anticipated here on Guam. The Church is true! Love, Elder Standage.
