I've been transferred to Newcastle, Wyoming which is about an hour and a half from Gillette, but it is still in the same stake. The Elders are being pulled out and the Sisters sent in. They call it 'Pink Washing'! The hope is that the Sisters can stir up more activity both among the members as well as investigators.

My Comp is a 'Greenie', Sister McCormick, from Washington. We will be the only missionaries in Newcastle. (See notes on Newcastle at end.) We actually will have district meetings over the phone and come to Gillette once a month. I thought Gillette was small - but there isn't even a Wal-Mart in Newcastle. Everyone is friendly and it's a lot like Mayberry. No one refers to street names

when giving you directions. It's always "over the bridge", "up the hill" and "past the creek". The ward is super enthusiastic and helpful and they treat us like celebrities. They have never had Sisters assigned to them before.

I don't know anybody in Newcastle or where anything is, so this is going to be starting from scratch. The mission president has put his trust in me, and given me a blessing so I know that it will be a really good experience. I just need to trust in the Lord.

It is supposed to snow tomorrow but I'm ready. I have a super cute red jacket that I got for twelve bucks at the local thrift store.

Our investigator Jamie, got baptized six weeks ago. Her husband Clint, at first, was against her getting involved in the church but he began to sit in on the lessons and did a complete turnaround. He stopped smoking all on his own and we hadn't even done the Word of Wisdom lesson with him yet. He set a baptism date of Oct 29. All he talks about is that he can't wait to get sealed in the temple to his family. It has been so amazing teaching them and seeing him change so much! I love this gospel and knowing that the Spirit can touch anyone's heart. I got permission to go back and give the Holy Ghost talk. With him being baptized, it feels like I have completed what I had to do in Gillette.

We had stake conference a few weeks ago. Elder Russell M. Nelson was the guest speaker! I got to shake his hand twice and to top it off, we had 8 investigators with us!

Everyone here is so excited about the temple that was announced for Wyoming. Star Valley is about 8 hours away, so the members here in this area will still go to the Billings temple which is only 4 hours away.

We met a neat lady here in Newcastle, at a local hamburger place. She came over and started talking to us. She had seen the Mormon Ad commercials that are playing in Minnesota. She wanted information about the Church. We were happy to give her a Book of Mormon. She told us she and her husband had been impressed with the messages and wanted this for their grandchildren. We have an appointment to teach them this next week. Also, we were knocking on doors and a lady answered and said she didn't really want to talk to us. She said her husband just died a month ago. We sympathized with her and told her Heavenly Father loves her. I asked her if she would like a hug and she broke down and said, "Yes!" She said we were an answer to her prayers. How cool is that?

She shared some personal stuff with me in broken English. Long story short, she accepted baptism. When we were leaving she was telling me how grateful she was that I came into her life and brought her the Gospel.

Notes on what I learned being a missionary this week: I buy everything from a local store called HEB. It's kinda like a Wal-Mart. The church gives me a card and loads it with 1700 pesos each month to use for my purchases. 2 Nephi Chapters 2 and 3 have come to have special meaning to me. It's like Lehi is counseling and talking to his sons Jacob and Joseph the same way a modern Dad counsels his teen sons. It's very real! I think the thing I miss the most is green grass and paved roads. Since I cut my hair short, I think it makes me look fatter, taller, and maybe like a little kid.

It was interesting to hear about all the Dana Ward changes at home! I hope all is going well! I have learned a lot here on my mission and grown so much. I have also gained a stronger testimony of the Gospel. The Lord loves us all and if we all serve and bring others unto him, we will be blessed and feel closer to him. I know this church is true and It is my hope and prayer that the Young Men at home will all want to serve a mission. I love you all. Continue in the faith! Mexico sends its love!



There are cockroaches everywhere! Because of them, we don't put our dishes in the cabinets. They are on racks on the table. The floor looked like a murder case so I was on my hands and knees scrubbing it. It looks a little better now. There were dead bugs in the shower and on the floor. I've learned that I can't stand living in a nasty place. My bed is made every morning first thing, and after studying, I organize the room so it's clean and tidy. So someone tell my mom she can relax! I like my room and house clean.

I can honestly say that I love these people! They are so awesome and so happy even though they barely have a roof over their heads and they have 10 people living in a little shack. It makes my heart hurt when they don't want the gospel or when they don't show up at church or read the Book of Mormon or pray. Yesterday only one investigator out of all we are working with, showed up at meetings. I was so disappoint-ed. I don't know what else I can do to help them. Every time we pray, we pray that we will have the Spirit in our lessons and that our investigators will feel it and come to church.

Our ward is such a good help to us. They always get us references and we are having a lot of success with that. This month we will be baptizing a mother and one of her daughters. So, little by little, we are piecing their family together for eternity. It is great to see the change in the people's lives as we teach them.. I love serving these people and serving the Lord. I feel such joy when I am in the service of our Lord. Time is going by really fast. I am happy, even when we have our bad days. I always feel our Father's love and the love of our Savior when the times are difficult. That is a great reminder that we are not alone!

Groundbreaking took place Oct 8, 2011 for the **Payson, Utah Temple**. Dallin H. Oakes officiated at the ceremony. The temple site is located at 930 West and 1550 South on the southwest side of Payson, one mile from the 800 South, Interstate 15 interchange.

The new temple will help to ease the heavy use of the Provo Temple, which is the busiest temple of the entire church. The new temple will serve approximately 22 stakes from Spanish Fork to Nephi, which amounts to about 78,000 LDS Church members.

The **Payson Temple** was announced in 2010. There are 15 temples either operating or announced in Utah.

In Peru, Elder Rafael E. Pino of the Seventy conducted groundbreaking ceremonies for the new **Trujillo Peru Temple.** 

The temple is being built on the site of an existing LDS meetinghouse in the Urbanización Primavera section of Trujillo. The site is located near the prominent Campo Eterno cemetery, on the highway to Huanchaco. The second LDS temple in Peru (the Lima Peru Temple was dedicated in 1986), it will serve more than 88,000 LDS Church members in the area. Currently many members of the church in the Trujillo Temple district must travel as much as 10 hours by bus to participate in ordinances in the Lima Temple.

The **Philadelphia Temple** groundbreaking ceremony was held Sept 17, 2011 at the 'Center City' site. The 70 million dollar, 60,000 square foot structure will be made of granite and will be similar to the Logan Temple in appearance, with a spire on each end of the structure. Just west of the temple site is the Family Courts Building and to the south is the Catholic Basilica of Saints Peter and Paul. It is expected to take 2.5 to 3 years to complete construction. Pres. Henry B. Eyring officiated and the Philadelphia mayor, Michael Nutter joined in the ground breaking ceremony.

In the October General Conference (2011), President Monson announced six new temples to be built: Paris, France; Barranquilla, Columbia; Durban, South Africa; Kinshasa, Congo; and Star Valley, Wyoming. The Provo, Utah Tabernacle that was destroyed by an accidental fire in December, 2010, will be rebuilt and converted to a temple. This will be the second temple in Provo. The current Provo temple is the busiest temple in the entire Church and the new temple will help relieve the strain on the current temple in the hometown of BYU.

This will be the second temple in Columbia. The Bogota temple was dedicated in 1999. The Kinshasa and Durban temples will be the fourth and fifth temples in Africa: Johannesburg, South Africa was dedicated in 1985, Accra, Ghana was dedicated in 2004 and the Aba, Nigeria temple was dedicated in 2005.

The exact location of the Paris, France temple is still being worked out.
