

Dear Family:

I got transferred. I'm now in Casper, Wyoming. In the 2 weeks I've been here, the wind has never dropped below 30mph with gusts of 65 mph. The weatherman calls it 'mild winds'! Mild winds my foot! It doesn't do any good to comb my hair before going out. The wind is constantly restyling for me and I need 5 more hands to keep my hair out of my face and to hold my skirt down. Thank goodness for leggings!

My companion is Sister Johnson, from Spokane, Washington and she has lots of brothers and sisters. She is way super nice and a hard worker. We have clicked



instantly. I'm excited to be here. After living in tiny towns for a year, it seems weird to be in a city with lots of people all around, food places to eat at and a shopping mall. I'm very excited for the adventures that await us!

We live with members in a HUGE house! They have a talking parrot and a few dogs. On my first day, we were home alone and I heard voices in another room. I thought there was someone in the house and Sister Johnson said, "It's the parrot!" I always thought it would be fun to have a talking parrot but now I don't think I'll ever want one. It makes noises like someone walking or the telephone ringing. Then it says, "Good Morning!" It watches me eat breakfast all the time. It is kind of creepy!

The work here is a little slow and not too much is happening. We need to get to work. We have set a goal to have 4 baptisms by April - which would be awesome! I know it will take a lot of work, but I also know that it can happen.

This seems like a harder area to find people. The people are more affluent than the people who lived in Gillette and New Castle. They seem more set in their ways and don't want to change so we have our work cut out for us. One day we were out knocking on doors and met a very angry man. He told us he didn't believe in God and finally launched into a tirade against Pres. Monson and was saying terrible things. So I told him to take it back ...! Before I got too worked up, I said, "Well, Sir, I'm sorry you feel that way. Then I testified how I know President Monson was called of God and that only through Jesus Christ can we be truly happy." Then I wished him a good day and we just left. What was interesting is that he was calm as we testified of Christ.

We have decided to focus on part member families. We visited one house where the husband is super nice but totally a "dry Mormon" (unbaptized). We invited him to take the lessons once again but he declined telling us that he is "happy where he is." Well... I was thinking, "Hmmm ... what can we do to change that thought?" My friend Tiffany sent me a Book of Mormon with her testimony written inside. I have been carrying it around for someone special to give it to. I felt prompted to give it to him and I told him how special this friend was to me and that she took the time to write her testimony. I told him that I hoped it wouldn't sit on his desk for two years and that I hope he will take the time to see what it is all about. I will let you know how it turns out!

I love the people in Newcastle so I was sad to leave - but it was also one of the hardest points of my mission. I definitely learned a lot, that is for sure! So, even though it was sad, it was also refreshing to get transferred.

The baptisms went great! Chase, the little boy, was so cute and was just beaming! His dad was able to baptize him. I know good things are going to happen for this family as they have been less active for years. It is so exciting seeing families unite in the gospel.

Travis's baptism was later the same evening. It was so neat. Travis gave the talk on the Holy Ghost and he was telling his family why he wanted this. He had scriptures in his talk. It was as if he had



been a member his whole life 'cause the talk was awesome! I was sitting by his mom and I leaned over and said, "You could have this too!" And she just said, "I know ... I feel really good right now." So I hope that they will be able to teach his family. It was sooo neat! When we first met Travis, he had a really scruffy beard. Well, he came to church one day with it shaved off and he cut his hair short! He wasn't getting a lot of hours at work and didn't have much money, but he figured out how to order his own leather bound 'quad' from the LDS internet site and bought them for himself. I was amazed!

That ward is such a neat ward. I love the people so much!!! They will always be part of my family.

We also got to attend a baptism in Gillette earlier this month, for a little girl who was 9. She was absolutely terrified of the water and it took about 30 minutes of her mom's encouragement for her to finally be brave enough to get into the water. They even closed the accordion doors so she could feel more comfortable. It was so neat once she decided to do it - because you could see how happy she was to be baptized.

There are so many good things that happened in Newcastle this month. I think the greatest thing that we have given to the ward is hope! They have had a lot of struggles as a ward. Many people have told us that we have helped bring the ward back to loving each other. They have been so excited to help out with the two baptisms and I can see good things happening in Newcastle. When we first got there, it was like walking on egg shells. Now everyone seems so friendly! Even without the baptisms, I think our greatest accomplishment in Newcastle has been seeing the uniting and healing within the ward.

HELLO FAMILY!!!

I have been transferred and my new area is in a place called Montemorelos, just a little southeast of Monterrey and Nuevo Leon. My new comp is named Elder Santiago from Lima, Peru. He is 22, about 5'4" and is a convert of about 3 years. He has about 7 months of his mission left. SO this area is sweet. It's really spacious. There is a lot of open area. We have to take a greyhound bus to our district meetings every Monday. The next area is an hour away. That's

how huge this place is. We have a lot of ranches and mountains. It's crazy how similar it is to northern AZ. Some parts of the area, I feel like I'm in a different

country. In one part, I feel I'm in Italy. Then another part of my area is mountains where people live on the side. It looks and feels like Brazil. There is even a huge statue on the top of a mountain like the statue of Christ in Brazil. It's way awesome! I love it. The branch is tiny! Our building is tiny as well. I gave

fluency has gone way up since being with a native. I'm pretty stoked about that! The members here are awesome! One of the members has a daughter that lives in Queen Creek, AZ. and she goes to visit every 6 months. She knows the area by the Mesa Temple pretty well. She has lots of pictures around that area so it makes me a little homesick, but then I get over it. We have 2 great investigators. One is named

Isidro. He is an 80 year

old man. He had a baptism date for him this week, but we had to put it off a bit. He is still working on his Word of Wisdom. Our other investigator is named Leticia. She is about 38 and is awesome. She drank coffee but after teaching her the Word of Wisdom, she doesn't even want it anymore. She has



a baptism date for the first week in February. It's pretty awesome! We have other investigators as well, but they aren't really progressing like these two. Last night, we met a family of 10 who all want to be

taught the Word of God. That's basically my news for this week. I'm excited to work here and get reestablished. I am always grateful to get your letters. I miss you all and love you so much! Have a wonderful week!

Here's the news from Ecuador. I have now survived my first transfer. I am so happy! It was hard to leave my companion and all of my investigators but I love this new area also. I am in the Zone-Quevedo North Sector-Valencia. My companion is Elder Tibanlombo. He is from



Quito and only he and his mother are members. They are still waiting on the father and sister to gain a testimony and be baptized. He showed me how to make 'Verde's' and 'Mas Dudos' yesterday. Our house is so much nicer than the other dumpster dive I was living in. It's a lot quieter without the other set of missionaries but

it's still good. It has been raining everyday, all day, since I've been here. But today the sun has no mercy and it is super humid. Less sun, but a lot more humidity! In the other house, we were without fans the whole time. In our new house we have a little air conditioner, which works magnificently. We are lucky to have one and it feels so nice to come home to cold air. On the street that we live on, every day they open up shops and put up tents and the street becomes a shopping mall, with food and stuff so we are going to buy our groceries right there. After that, we have to wash our own clothes, so that's a time waster! We have blackouts (electricity goes off) everyday. It is so crazy, my comp said it happens all throughout Ecuador but it only happened once in Guayaquil and we were all asleep. But it's really fun here.

Our area is in the boonies! It has like 5-10 little pueblitos, or small towns. We live in Valecia and we proselyte here mostly. Tomorrow however, we are going to Agua Claras. Mangos are 15-25 for a dollar so even better news. Next week we are going to go out to a waterfall that's in our area. So that's going to be sweet. It's beautiful here with mountains, and everything is green.



Elder Tibanlombo has only one more transfer than me in mission life, so we make 'awesome missionaries' to be working together. My comp said that about 100 people are in our ward but only 40 attended Sunday meetings. That was sad, but we will see what we can do to help the bishop. I passed the sacrament with a little 12-year-old deacon and I already have one of our investigator's children calling me his cousin. So

I think I'm doing pretty good out here. I can't complain.

The best news is that we have about 5 baptisms scheduled this month. One this week (if we can get permission from a mother) and four on the 28th. All of these investigators are ready. They have been prepared for many years with



many missionaries. So please Pray For Our Investigators!!!!!! God has given us so many miracles this week and I don't want to fail him. I love my new area and we are already having some success.

SPECIAL NOTE OF INTEREST
Pres. Wallace and Sister Edith Haws
have been called to serve a two year
mission as the coordinators of Humanitarian
Services for the Church in the Dominican

Republic. They report to the Provo MTC

March 26, 2012 where they will receive a week of training and then spend another week at Welfare Square in Salt Lake before traveling to the Dominican Republic. The missionaries they are replacing will be released before the Hawses arrive, so they are already in contact and exchanging information. Pres. Haws speaks some Spanish but he and Sister Haws are taking an intensive Spanish Language course in preparation for their Service Mission.

Their responsibilities will have them working with and coordinating with other churches, the Red Cross and local government agencies and facilities. They will have a car and expect to be driving



many miles. Many of the residents live in remote villages with crude and primitive farming methods, and unreliable or non-existent

sanitary drinking water and sanitary conditions. The civil engineering skills of Pres. Haws will be of great benefit in helping design and provide reliable and sanitary drinking water, filtration and distribution systems. His many years of gardening will be valuable in helping to teach better methods and more productive food crops suitable for the local soil conditions. They will also work with orphanages, neo-natal training, hospitals and help design and make available, reliable electricity to remote areas.

Right now, accidents or illnesses that cause damage to legs, often result in the amputation of the legs because there are few available doctors to properly set or repair broken limbs. This area consequently has a great number of individuals with missing legs. The Church has already invested several years in providing wheelchairs and is now working on training local individuals to make prosthetics. Two individuals currently make prosthetics in a

small, single room facility and they are now teaching others these same skills.

Children play in ditches that carry contaminated water and sewage, often resulting in sickness and sometimes, death. Education and better facilities could

eliminate this problem. The Hawses are taking their many skills and years of experience to an area that will be greatly benefited by



their service. We can follow their adventures on their blog site: hawsdradventure.blogspot.com.
