This has been another great week! We have a total of seven now, that have committed to baptism. Two of these are the kids of less active parents. The sad part is that they have no knowledge of Heavenly Father or Jesus Christ. One of the boys at the start of the lessons asked "Well, who is God anyway?" I had to take a moment to think how to explain that. He is a teenage boy and is so thirsty for knowledge about Heavenly Father and knew nothing. It made me realize the importance of the role of the mother teaching her kids the gospel concepts and how much this knowledge helps to strengthen our families. By the end of the first lesson they were really excited about what they were learning. I think it is neat that we never really stop learning things about the Gospel.

The 'cat people' are doing really good. We've had a few lessons with them and we also helped them move to another apartment. As we taught them about the law of chastity we learned that they are not married. They are receptive to the plans for them to get married. They came to church last Sunday and they loved it!

We have really been trying to come up with new ways to find more investigators to teach. We spent a day trying some surveys that are a good way to approach people and ask them what they believe. That same day we taught a total of eight lessons. The norm for us is a maximum of three lessons in any one day. That was definitely a faith building experience. We got to talk to so many people and it was so neat! I don't know why we didn't think about this resource before.

That same day we had a guy call us and ask us if we wanted to come over for dinner. He said he had met us and talked to us before. Well then it clicked! Three months ago, we were tracting and we had sat

on this guy's porch and talked. He wasn't interested in our message, so we left, still respecting each other. So now he calls us three months later and says he would like to have us over for dinner. So we went and had a BBQ with him and his wife. They are great people and we are excited to start teaching them.

On Sunday, the White family came to church and this means that they can now set a date to have their kids baptized. The parents are members but have not been active for years. The Mom got up and bore her testimony and so did the oldest daughter! That was really awesome! We were so excited! I think the parents are really serious about changing their lives and habits. I know that Heavenly Father has answered my prayers and is helping me build my own faith. I know that there are lots of people looking for the gospel and I hope we can find as many as possible. I love this work. It truly is incredible! August and my release are fast approaching. I don't want this to end!

All I can say is that the missionaries wish it was larger numbers, but we have a 'steady trickle'. It isn't really about the numbers, but we love them when they come! My Companion and myself have actually baptized six, but for record purposes, some we had to leave because of transfers and other missionaries completed teaching them and actually did the baptism ordinance. Then, with transfers, we picked up a few who were already being

taught and completed the lessons and baptized them. So, it evens out all around.

Someone also asked about whether we can get pizza here. We can, but they don't do the garlic and cheese on the crust. It's sad I know. We have to eat ours 'plain', but pizza in any form is still awesome to a missionary!

Sounds like dad had a fun Fathers Day! Mine was full of drunks yelling at us and appointments that fell through, but some days are just like that. The pictures of the family 'backhouse' at home, looks sweet with all the renovations! I'm kinda weary of tile floors because that's just about all everyone has here. The 'Big Dream' of the Americans here, is to get to stretch out on a carpeted floor when they get home! Another thing we worry about is going back to the States to discover that we cannot function with all the new technology.

I appreciated the notes from the Return
Missionary's talk from the Dana Ward Sacrament
Meeting. It sounds like he was an awesome
missionary and dedicated to service as a missionary. I
would hope that I'm able to express myself half as
well when I get home, and am able to share some
special missionary moments. I love the story about
Alma. It gets me pumped up to do meaningful
missionary work!

If I remember correctly, Marinda Hunt will be coming home soon. That will be cool!

I can hardly wait to get to meet Darwin Chapman's wife. I hope I get to continue as his Home Teacher. I wonder if he ever got a chance to finish his Hot Tub? He was working on that before I came out to the Mission Field. I thoroughly enjoyed visiting in his home.

I appreciate all the support and help my family has given me while here as a missionary. The gospel is true. I love my parents and family and hope everyone has a WONDERFUL week!!!






I love sharing the gospel with others. I am so glad for the opportunity I have to serve the Lord and the people in Virginia. I know the gospel is true.

### NEIGHBORHOOD BURGLARY ALERT

Just to alert the neighborhood- You should all know that during the last two weeks of June, the neighborhood west of Gilbert Rd. and north of Broadway, has been targeted by home break-ins, burglaries and theft. Several ward families or their neighbors, have been victimized and others have actually encountered the thieves. Their methods seem to always be the same: one rings the doorbell at one of the front doors, during mid morning, at houses with no cars in the driveway. If no one answers, they go to the back yard and break in through a door or window. They are taking guns, cash, computers and other electronics. It is assumed that they are escaping thru the alley with their 'booty'. Of the two sightings of the 'perps', they are about 5' 8", unshaven, dark Mexican males, black hair and slight to medium build. A couple of ward members have been home alone or with their children and were busy so did not answer the door, only to find these unknown men either in their back yard (said they were looking for some place to go to the bathroom) or found them inside their house. They are probably assuming that if no one answers the

door and there is no vehicle in the driveway, there is no one home and they are trying to strike before the owners come home for lunch. They are brazen and should be considered dangerous. If you suspect anyone who knocks on your door, do not answer the door and do not let them in. If possible, take their picture through a window as they are leaving and call the police. Alert your neighbors and watch each other's homes and be observant of any suspicious, unknown people loitering around on your street or in yards.
