This past week has been very good. OK, I have to start with a great miracle. We have been teaching a couple, Araceli and Alfredo. She has been to church many times and has been taught now for like a year. He started showing interest in the gospel right before I got into this area. We were teaching them, nothing was really happening, they weren't progressing or keeping commitments. A few weeks ago we tried to see them and she said things aren't really going well. So we stopped by this past Friday to see them, had a Charla franca, basically told them how things were and asked if they were ready to make this change in their lives. He said he was, so we setup to go back the next day. Well he kept his appointment, she had to run an errand, but he was there so we were able to teach him. We committed them to come to church and they had come before but NEVER stayed for the most important part, sacrament meeting, because of their two kids (adorable by the way) Jacob and Anayi. Well sacrament meeting started and still none of our investigators had shown up. The opening prayer was said and afterwards in walked Araceli Alfredo and Family. We were so excited. We got calls Saturday, I am being moved from the Albany area, after 3 wonderful transfers and am going a hop, skip and a jump (literally) 9 miles down the road to Corvallis. That puts me just barely safely inside the Great OREGON EUGENE MISSION—HOOOORAY!!!!!!!

I am very excited to be able to stay with my wonderful mission president, President Young. He is truly a man called of GOD. I have such love and respect for that man; it's hard to explain the connection between missionary and mission President, that I feel so blessed to have.

My new companion is a native speaker. I don't know too much about him at all. His name is Elder Garcia and I won't meet him till about 2:30 today. I am so excited to be able to take my Spanish to the next level though. I am also so excited to work in Corvallis. I have heard such great things about this area and a lot of the members here in Albany have friends in Corvallis and work over there, so it is quite possible I will get to run into them again.

My companion, Elder Johnson, and I have had a wonderful time together during his training. I feel so blessed to have had the opportunity of working with such a dedicated heartfelt missionary who truly loves what he is doing; that has a firm testimony and a great desire to do what is right. He is going to a little town called Venita. It's near Eugene and he is going to actually be switching, at least for this transfer, to English and will be follow up training a new missionary. He's a bit nervous about it but I know he can do it and so does President Young. So that means with both of us going that the area is being whitewashed, as Albany as of July 1 will be part of the new Salem mission. When we got here to this area last Monday, we called the group leader, Brother Wolfe. He took us over to his house and we were able to eat dinner, then had Family home evening.

Afterwards Brother Rios gave us a ride home. We did a lot of tracting this past week, really trying to find a lot of new investigators to teach. The other missionaries were taken out of the area because one of the Elders (Elder French) had to go home for emergency surgery. So it'd been several weeks since they were here.

We kind of scrambled around, calling people, trying to see who they had worked with and where we could pick up this week. We were actually able to find one new investigator, so that was really cool. My companion is Mexican. He moved here to the states about 8 years ago, when he was 15. Elder Garcia was trained by Elder Anderson who I sent you a picture of a couple weeks ago. He's an awesome missionary, has a real love for the gospel and knows what difference it makes in peoples lives because it saved his family. We speak to each other in Spanish 90% or more of the time. I love it. I can already tell my skills are improving, even after only 1 week.

The following is the letter I sent to my mission President. Things are going very good now and I know that Heavenly Father will help us through all things. In a meeting a few weeks ago someone said: "God knows our doubts, fears and weaknesses, but he also knows are dreams." I know that is true.

I would like to share something with you, an answer to prayer.

I got to this area of Corvallis and was fine the first day, but then doubts started to creep in and I thought the area book hasn't been updated, our teaching pool is super small and it just doesn't seem possible. I was feeling quite overwhelmed by what I thought was lacking. I also got thinking how in the previous two areas I had been in I hadn't had any baptisms. I read my patriarchal blessing to seek comfort on a couple occasions this week. I turned to the Lord in prayer and this Sunday as part of the Fast for Elder French, I also included a special plea that Heavenly Father would help me to have faith. I really felt that my faith was weak and I was doubting.

I testify with all the energy of Heart that my Heavenly Father Answered that prayer. During church our group mission leader related the story of his Brother who served a faithful mission, was a great missionary, but then fell off the path when he got home and started hanging out with the wrong people. He talked about how he ended up loosing his testimony and even going to jail because of the choices he made. The spirit brought to my remembrance your words about being converted to the Lord and staying strong after my mission, even then I was reflecting on what my Brother in Law told me about success in the mission, how he knew missionaries that didn't have a lot of baptisms but they gave their missions everything and loved it, while others baptized a whole lot but are now less active and want nothing to do with the church. He explained the difference in success about becoming converted myself.

Then after church, as if what I had already felt and learned wasn't enough, we were talking to our WML and he said "Well let's just get out there and find more people. I know it's hard when you don't have a lot of people in your teaching pool, but have faith, don't get discouraged. Faith really does bring miracles and besides this is fun"

Dear Familia.

How ya'll doing? If you are worried about me, don't be or not much anyway. Life is good here for the most part. Food is good. First day I got here was right after lunch so I ate at 6 am and then at 545 pm, so I was getting super stressed out with everything going on and no food. After all the classes and dinner and and we were in our "residence" and I gathered everyone together all 4 in our room and we had a "Quadcompanionship" prayer and after that it really helped me realize that I'll be ok here and on the mission. But it is a ton of fun. There are people from all over the world and definately more sister missionaries. So many good people are here. It is so cool to see no one texting. Everyone looks so engaged and intelligent so that is cool. The days are long, weeks are getting shorter. We are up and out of bed at 6:30 and in bed by 10:30 and every moment in between is completely filled with classes and activitites. Last night we got to our room at 10:00 pm instead of 9:00 pm but we had a very spiritual branch president meeting, where I was called to be the DL (district leader) and it was received very well by both zone and district. After that meeting, Elder Sellers asked for a blessing of comfort so the elders from our district gathered together and placed our hand on his head and his companion Elder Lovelin the blessing. It was wonderful and it also helped pull the elders together in our district which is all good. The classes are really getting me to think and act. I'm even starting to take notes. Today, me and my companion, Elder Burdick, taught an "investigator" (a teacher that acts like one although very convincing). It truly humbled us both and at least I know that I am getting truer knowledge of what a great but very difficult mission, but that all of everything starts with love whether with an investigator, the wards, or even the companions you are placed with. I am, I think, I am a bit more nervous about the field and I wish now I could stay in the MTC for the first year to learn as much as I can.

Yes Elder Munday was born and raised in England until 12 he then moved back and forth to florida utah and england because his dad is a buisness man and required much traveling he went to high school in american fork utah though, nice kid but so far we have got alot of work done so far we have 2 baptisms this week on wednesdayso thats super exciting and ill be baptising (elder munday is 6'7" and about 350 pounds) so he is not particularly fond of doing it so i was more than glad to volenteer. He is a great guy mostly down to earth and truly cares about other people so its nice to be around him. I am in a college town but one i have never heard of haha not at all like tempe it is super small here everything is really spread apart and there are alot of welders here, there is like 5 pipelines going through the town so they need alot of welders right here right now like a ton of welders in town, i havent really seen that many college kids yet there is also a really big casino so alot of people work there. weather is really nice it does get pretty humid after it rains but not to bad. i am so proud of lizzie make sure to give her a kiss on the head for me. sorry i havent written back to your letter you and lizzie both wrote me i just am so busy during the day the ward that we cover is about 62 miles north and south and 56 miles east and west and the next closest missionarries are in McKinney which is about an hour and half away, thank you for the message of the law of consencration it really helps me to get the proper mindset on what
