6/3/13

We found two new investigators this week. First was Alex. We were tracting this apartment complex and knocked a couple doors. We were about to leave but then both decided to go to one last building in the complex and just knock a couple doors to see if they might be Spanish. Well, the second door we knocked, was Alex. Young guy, going to college, and he is from Mexico City. He let us right in, taught him a very spiritual lesson on the Restoration. We both felt on top of the world after the lesson. He agreed to read and pray about 3 Nephi 11 and we got a return appointment.

Directly after that appointment, we went to see Daniel. We had met him tracting in this neighborhood and he was picking up his daughter from the babysitters house. We asked if he had ever talked to missionaries before, he said not really, but readily gave his phone number and address. So we were able to stop by and talk to him. He is a really neat guy, has 3 daughters from 9 months to 16. Really family oriented kind of guy, just might be a little harder for him to accept everything, it kind of seemed. He really knows the scriptures and has attended a Baptist church. But he's genuine and willing to listen. It was actually really funny, because he asked Elder Garcia where he was from and Elder Garcia told him Tapic Nagarit, which is in Mexico, anyway then te turned, looked at me and said "and you are from Argentina right?" I said "no, I'm from Marizona." He said "oh, the way you say Yo which is "I" in Spanish, made me think you were from Argentina." I guess Hno Henriquez, a member from my last area (Albany), rubbed off on me too much and I picked up on the accent they have for the y sound.

Fast forward now to Saturday morning. The week had been going really well, had a good district meeting, had good studies the whole week, found new investigators, etc. But for some reason, I woke up and felt off. Saturday we met an Incredible family. Luis is the dads name and the kids I can't remember. He didn't invite us in because he had to go prepare for finals, but you know how they talk about elect people. The feeling we had as we talked to this man was an undeniable feeling from the Holy Ghost, that we were talking to a genuine seeker of truth. He is from Peru, has friends who are members and very graciously accepted a Book of Mormon. He seemed shocked and just wowed that we were just going to give it to him; the way he took it in his hands, it was like it really meant something to him. Then his teenage daughter asked if we had another one that we could give her because she really wanted to read it. It was awesome.

But still, throughout the day, I just had kind of this nagging feeling. Well, later that afternoon we missed a call from the Assistants. I didn't think too much of it, we called back, they weren't available but texted saying they'd call later. When they finally called back, around 6:30, they asked if we were both on the line and available "yes" we replied. They then told us that Elder Garcia was going to be transferred, due to the Visa Waiters getting their visas. So we thought, "wow, OK, so what time Monday do we need to be in Eugene?" we asked and they said "not Monday, you need to be there tomorrow at 3. So we turned back to the apartment, he started packing, I helped as much as I could before an appointment at 8, with an eternal investigator (meaning they have investigated the church for a LONG time).

We went to this lesson and were teaching the Plan of Salvation. At the end of it, everything hadn't clicked, we explained, testified, asked questions and heard her answers. It was probably one of the most spiritual lessons that we'd had and all three of us: me, Elder Carcia, and Hermano Becera were definitely following promptings from the Holy Ghost, he was working through us definitely and it was a huge testimony builder. But, she denied a baptismal date. It is so true what Elder Bednar says that "we cannot force truths into the heart of an investigator. The Holy Ghost can work through us, can guide us, but ultimately, even he can only bring truth Unto the heart. It is up to the seeker of truth to allow it into the heart."

Sunday after church, we had a break the fast. We got some pictures with our Group before heading to Eugene. I hung out with the Spanish Elders for the afternoon evening in Eugene from 3:30 till 9:30, when my new companion arrived back from Medford. His name is Elder Fernandez and is from Dominican Republic. Which, if I remember correctly, is where Tyson Hill served his mission, along with Justin Schnepf. We already get along really well. He's lived in Idaho for the past while and before that in Minnesota during his High school years. He likes to play rugby and he has only been out 5 weeks.

So my trainer, Elder Ketchum, got him mid-transfer last transfer and then this transfer, they split the area of Medford, where they were at, and got two visa waiters with them. So he was basically being trained and training at the same time. Pretty crazy. But anyways, now he is with me for follow up training and Elder Ketchum, my trainer, still has one other visa waiter. The other two missionaries serving down in Medford are my previous companion, Elder Garcia, who is with my trainee, Elder Johnson, now. SO, it is pretty funny how it all worked out. I got to see Elder Johnson at the transfer spot and he was so excited to see me, he yelled from across the parking lot when he saw me pull up. I was so glad to see him too, he's an awesome missionary. Well, that's all I've got for now. I hope you all have a blessed week.
