Dear Family & Friends,

This week has gone pretty good. We didn't reach all of our goals, but we definitely saw some really cool miracles happen. We started teaching a guy named Israel. He is in a power chair and is only 18. He has been reading in the Book of Mormon and likes it. It's just hard for him to understand. We really wanna get him to church but he isn't comfortable doing that right now, so we really gotta help him out with that. He has some physical disabilities and doesn't have complete control of his movements. He is really sincere though and is willing to keep learning and progressing. This morning, Monday, we went over and taught him. We watched the Restoration video with him.

This Saturday, the Corvallis stake had its 50th anniversary celebration. They had a huge Salmon bake at a park called Avery Park, here in Corvallis. There was a TON of fish. We were asked to help with it. Since there is very limited parking at the park, they had people park at Reser Stadium at OSU, then a 12 passenger van as well as a small bus, about the size of a short bus, came and shuttled families over to the park. We helped people unload their stuff at the park, then we directed people to wait for the shuttle over at the stadium. It was a lot of fun. We got to eat a lot of good Salmon. At first they were thinking that they would run out of food. But it turned out that many people didn't show up, so there was more than enough.

As another part of the celebration, the stake put on a play. It wasn't some small event either; I mean it was like a full blown production, with a 10 minute intermission and everything. Every companionship was assigned a night to go and usher at the play. We went this past Thursday. We had to leave at 8:30, so we missed the last three scenes, but what we saw was really cool. It was called "Promised Valley." It talked about the pilgrimage of the Saints who crossed the plains; quite a few non members attended and it seemed like a really good production. They actually even had an orchestra, which was really neat.

Yesterday we met this way cool guy out tracting. He has a couple projects restoring some trucks: one was a '63 Chevy and it's completed and looked amazing. The current project is a '50 Chevy and he is making it look real cool. We got to share part of the restoration with him right on the doorstep and he took the pamphlet. He also gave us his phone number and told us we were welcome to send the English elders by so they could teach him more.

I know that the Lord is allowing me to become who he wants me to become here on my mission. It really is the refiners fire, I feel at times, but it's like the Lord told Joseph, "know ye not that all these things shall work together for your good" I must keep the faith. In my last area the baptisms I had first was Kyu Brown a young boy from a less active family and he was just a ray of sunshine. He was a bit socially off, but he was very darling and will turn into a great man one day. The next person is Marcus Stephens, he was about 25 and we found him through other members in the ward. He was quick to accept the gospel into his life and is striving to live the gospel even though his wife is not wanting to live the gospel because she feels it was pushed on her at a young age and doesn't want it in her life again. So he was struggling with that. Next is Carol Holme he was married to a member who had been inactive for many, many years and when they moved from St. George to Durrant. She became a lot more active and we began to talk to him. He already had a testimony of the gospel, he was just having a hard time with the word of wisdom and we got him to set a date by saying "ok you know its true when are you gonna do it" and he said "yeah ok, lets do it." Ha Ha, it was pretty dang cool.

The next is such a sweet lady named Julie Brink. She moved from California. Her life got completely flipped upside down. She had been meeting with the missionaries before I got there, but just went down hill and we couldn't meet with her for like 3 weeks and we finally did and we were all in tears talking about how great she is and I could really connect with her and really gained a love for that lady and Daughter of God. She realized she needed to change, she realized the environment she was in was not where she needed to be.
