

So the past week was great. One of our investigators, Luis Marquez, 20yr old OSU student, we had some really, really good lessons with this week. Brother Palmer came to both lessons and we really helped him out, hopefully with some of his doubts. He absolutely believes that the Catholic church is the correct church but he is still willing to investigate.

We went and saw a less active guy named Miguel Angel. In the road, I saw a snake as we road over. It was a residential side street so I pulled over, then turned around and as I did a Car swerved to miss it. Anyway he luckily did miss it and we moved the reptile to the side of the road. I picked him up and held it and got pics, but I will send them next week.

Well I love you all. Oh I forgot to mention this area is an English ward, so for at least this transfer and I believe president said, the next 3 months. So next 2 transfers I am an English Missionary. But I am brown at heart.

I didn't mention last week, dunno why, I guess because it is not super important, but I am also the District Leader here. Yeah when President called with transfers, he really laid it on me. First, switching me to English felt like I was being sent home, training, then being called to be DL as well. No I am doing fine really, it wasn't that big of a deal. I know that the Lord has me here for a reason. I think already I am beginning to see why and I am so excited to be an instrument in HIS hands. Because in HIS Strength I can do ALL Things.

There is a less active family here who is Hispanic. And I dunno but I feel in part, that may be something or part of the reason why the Lord has me here. We visited them and I got to talk to Brother Batista. He is a really good man and guess what? He CAME TO CHURCH this Sunday!!! Hooray!!! Plus he has a 19yr old son who is undecided on whether or not he wants to go on a mission. I really hope we can help motivate him to serve. He seems like a really good kid. We are teaching a woman named Marti who at first said she just had questions. The other elders before had shared some about family history and just answered a bunch of questions she had. But this past week we got to teach part of the Restoration. She really seemed to like it and I can just see and the member who is fellow-shipping her said the same thing. We both think within a month or so she will be asking if she can be baptized. There are other part member families and just a lot waiting to happen here in this area. Creswell only has about 5,000 people, then we cover a small portion of Cottage Grove, a neighboring town 9ish miles away, as well we cover a couple other small places called Pleasant Hill and Lorain. It is a lot of fun. I super love this area and President Young is super unpredictable, but he said twice now that I will probably be an English speaking missionary for a couple transfers.

I am so happy, I want all of you to know. It says in Preach My Gospel that more happiness and Joy awaits you as you serve among HIS children. This I know to be true. I know I have a Living Loving Heavenly Father. I know Jesus Christ is his son and is my Savior and that in and through him we can find True joy. Only by following his way will we find true lasting happiness. I know that he came to earth and died for us, not only that, he lived for us, he set the perfect example for us to follow and lives today as a glorified resurrected being who wants us to return to the presence of the Father, eternally, with Our Families. 
