



Scripture: "Jesus saith unto him, I am the way, the truth, and the life: no man cometh unto the Father, but by me" (John 14:6).





We thought it will really help them as they are starting to quit their addictions. We also thought Andon would enjoy one as well. It was awesome to see them have the desire to change their life. We can tell that the spirit was there in our lesson. I know they were able to feel the sprit because they gave up those things on the spot.

I love being able to witness lives change and seeing them come closer to Jesus Christ. It is such an amazing feeling. I love sharing the gospel. It brings me so much joy!
